Work activity description is the operation of the Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District. This inspection was carried for education and consultation purposes.

Three employer and one worker representative from the Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District Ltd. were involved in this inspection.

Items reviewed during the course of the inspection with Salt Spring Island Fire Protection District Ltd. included but were not limited to:

Joint Health and Safety Committee

Discussed the functions of the joint health and safety committee in relation to identifying and addressing safety hazards through inspections and safety meetings. Discussed how issues are resolved between the committee and employer.

Asbestos Inventory

This firm had a hazardous materials survey completed for this location. Discussed ensuring that the information related to the location of identified asbestos is communicated. Reference Northwest Environmental file # 26632RIVI.0.

Discussed the difference between non-destructive and destructive surveys.

Mold

Discussed the process for addressing suspected mold.

Walkway Widths

Discussed walkway widths in relation to the safe movement of equipment and materials.

Mezzanine Access

Discussed safe access via ladder systems to this area.

Guardrail Construction

Discussed the specifics of guardrail construction related to the mezzanine area.

Ergonomics and Material Storage

Discussed ergonomics in relation to the materials storage area adjacent to mezzanine landing area.

Hose Storage

Discussed ergonomics in relation to the materials storage area and possible restraining of hoses.

Painting (Indoors)

Discussed the Lower Explosive Limits (LEL) and Upper explosive limits (UEL) in relation to indoor fumes and possible ventilation requirements. Small time painting jobs shall be done outside when possible to avoid possible exposures to concentrated fumes or vapours.

Single Pane Glass

Discussed the hazard of single pane glass in relation to fire fighter movements within the building and possible public interactions. This was to be addressed considering worker exposures based on the hazard and the amount of times workers are exposed to this hazard.

Ventilation

Discussed ventilation within the this location. This firm was redirected to the WorksafeBC hygiene department for further information. No ventilation issues were noted at the time of this inspection.

Annual Hearing Tests

Discussed the fact that hearing tests are to be conducted and recorded annually for employees and within 6 months of the initial hiring

Fall Protection

Discussed the following with regards to Fall Protection:

- The fall protection hierarchy of guardrails first, worker restraint second and fall arrest as the third option
- A written plan is needed for work above 25 feet (clock tower) worked with this firm to create this document
- Anchor points
- CSA approved components
- Guardrails on tower windows
- Control zone procedure for flat roof work supplied this firm with the procedures for control zones
- Retractable Lanyrads
- 800lbs for worker restraint anchors
- 5000lbs for fall arrest anchors

Hose Drying

Discussed hook and block and i beam set up.

Tower Stair Access

Discussed reviewing the access stairs up to the top of the clock tower.
